This Fund will provide financial support for community groups, charities and social enterprises, to implement recovery strategies as a response to the impact of Covid-19. Grants will be awarded to organisations who are currently working with people and communities most affected by the pandemic, to enable them to build resilience and continue to adapt and develop their activities and approaches, especially to integrate a return to service delivery, where possible.
